CANCELLATIONS:

TRANSPORTATION:

Everyone attending D1 Junior Leadership Camp will be responsible for their own transportation to High Plains Retreat Center in Canyon, TX.

Eat lunch before arriving to camp!

WHAT TO BRING:

- A. Personal toilet articles, hand mirror, shower shoes, insect repellent.
- B. Flashlight.
- C. Sheets, pillow and case, towels. A sleeping bag is desirable.
- D. Swimming suit, towels, flipflops or swim shoes (for swimming only) and any other swimming items needed.
- E. Sunscreen
- F. Jacket and warm clothing. Raincoats or windbreakers may be needed.
- G. Hiking clothes and <u>sturdy shoes</u>. Two or more pairs of shoes may be needed. Sandals and slides are not suitable for most activities. Be realistic when planning what clothes to take.
- H. Snack items and/or money for snacks (some are provided). Snack bar will be available at your own cost.
- I. Dance Clothes DANCE THEME IS SPACE

SWIMMING:

Boys/men must wear shirts at all times, for safety purposes, except while swimming, no speedos. Girls/women must wear a dark cover up, if they are wearing a two-piece swimsuit, or wear dark cover up if a one-piece swim suit is revealing and not modest.

<u>ORIENTATION</u>: PLEASE prepare your 4-H'ers for a camping atmosphere in the canyon - and camp-type food. Discuss with each delegate personal hygiene, community living, cooperation with others, work assignments, and code of conduct...

4-H'ERS SHOULD...

- A. Follow the camp rules set by Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and High Plains Retreat Center.
- B. Know the 4-H pledge, the 4-H prayer and Texas pledge.
- C. Be on time and ready to participate in all ceremonial services.
- D. Show courtesy during ceremonial services.
- E. BE PREPARED TO CARRY OUT THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES IN CEREMONIALS, ETC.

SUPERVISION:

4-H members should be prepared to respond to supervision from all county agents present, not just their county agent.

All adults should attend educational workshops along with 4-H members.

AUTHORIZATION FOR MEDICAL CARE/MEDICAL INFORMATION/CODE OF CONDUCT: These forms are required

to be completed and turned in at the time of arrival:

- 1. Code of Conduct and Consequences of Misbehavior
- 2. <u>Release & Medical Treatment</u>
- 3. <u>Authorization to Dispense Medication</u> *For campers who will be bringing medication with them.
- 4. Medical Information for HPRC
- 5. Media & Photography Release
- 6. <u>High Plains Retreat Indemnity Form</u>
- 7. <u>4-H Indemnity Form & Waiver</u>
- 8. Health Statement

These forms should be completed and signed by the parent or guardian **AND** can be witnessed by any of the county Extension agents or assistants. <u>4-H'ers who do not have Authorization for Medical Care forms or whose</u> <u>forms are incomplete will not be allowed to stay at camp</u>. One agent or leader from each county is to give the completed Authorization for Medical Care to <u>the 4-H Specialist or Nurse once they arrive at camp</u>.

The insurance for **District 1 4-H Junior Leadership Camp** is only intended for 4-H'ers to cover accidents occurring during or on the road to and from POWER Camp. The policy covers a very minimal amount of expenses and acts as a supplemental policy to other primary insurance. IT WILL NOT COVER ANY PRE-EXISTING INJURY OR ILLNESS.
