Contest Begins: Juniors-5:00 pm Friday, April 25
Intermediates/Seniors - 7:00 a.m. Saturday, April 26

Contest Location: Amarillo Rifle and Pistol Club
7650 N. Western, 2.2 miles north of Loop 335 (east side of the road)

Age classes: Junior- Grades 3, 4 and 5
Intermediate - Grades 6, 7 and 8
Senior - Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12

No limit as to how many teams are entered per county.

Accommodations

- Requests for accommodations must be submitted to the District Office from the County Office at least 2 weeks prior to the event.
- This request must be accompanied by official documentation in one of the following options for why the request is being submitted:
 - A) Official doctor's note from a licensed medical professional
 - B) School documentation and/or evaluation from a public institution
 - C) Official evaluation from a licensed professional therapist and/or diagnostician

Guns will be inspected by the Safety Officer. If deemed unsafe at any point of the shoot, the gun will be removed from the line.

Juniors will fire three prone stages for a total of 30 record shots in 30 minutes-no exceptions.

Intermediates and Seniors will fire a quarter course, which is a target in each of the three positions, prone, standing, kneeling (10 shots X 3 positions) as we have done in the past. This will be done with a 1-hour time limit.

Juniors will shoot April 25 and have their awards after the shooting concludes. Intermediates and Seniors will shoot April 26 with awards following the shootout.

*If a senior shooter has a conflict due to 4-H Scholarship Interviews, please contact Tina Bryant for an alternative shooting time.

*****RIFLE PROFICIENCY FORMS must be signed by youth and coach then submitted at check in day of the contest. This is a required form to shoot. Those that fail to submit form at check in will be ineligible to compete. *****
