Packing for Camp:

- A. Personal toilet articles, hand mirror, shower shoes, insect repellent.
- B. Flashlight.
- C. Sheets, pillow and case, towels. A sleeping bag/blanket is desirable.
- D. Swimming suit, towels, flipflops or swim shoes (for swimming only) and any other swimming items needed. Boys/men must always wear shirts, for safety purposes, except while swimming, no speedos. Girls/women must wear a dark cover up, if they are wearing a two-piece swimsuit, or wear dark cover up if a one-piece swimsuit is revealing and not modest.
- E. Sunscreen
- F. Jacket and warm clothing. Raincoats or windbreakers may be needed.
- G. Hiking clothes and <u>sturdy shoes</u>. Two or more pairs of shoes may be needed. Sandals and slides are not suitable for most activities. Be realistic when planning what clothes to bring.
- H. Snack items and/or money for snacks (some are provided).

Prior to Camp:

Required forms: These forms are **required** to be completed and turned in at the time of arrival:

- 1. Code of Conduct
- 2. <u>Consequences of Misbehavior</u>
- 3. <u>Authorization to Dispense Medication</u> *For campers who will be bringing medication with them.
- 4. Over the Counter Medication Permission Form
- 5. Medical Information for HPRC
- 6. High Plains Retreat Indemnity Form
- 7. 4-H Indemnity Form & Waiver
- 8. Health Statement

These forms should be completed and signed by the parent or guardian. <u>4-H'ers who do not have these forms</u> complete will not be allowed to stay at camp. Forms will be given to the camp nurse upon arrival.

The insurance for **North Region 4-H Senior POWER Camp** is only intended for 4-H'ers to cover accidents occurring during or on the road to and from POWER Camp. The policy covers a very minimal amount of expenses and acts as a supplemental policy to other primary insurance. IT WILL NOT COVER ANY PRE-EXISTING INJURY OR ILLNESS.

4-H members that are 18 at the time of camp will be required to participate in a Child Protection Training offered by High Plains Retreat Center. Travel to Camp:

Everyone attending the North Region Senior POWER Camp will be responsible for their own transportation to and from the High Plains Retreat Center.

At Camp:

- All meals during camp are furnished. Bring money at your own risk. Some may need to bring money for meals during travel to and from*ask your county.
- OFFICER ELECTIONS: District Council officers for both District 1 and District 2 will be elected at the North Region 4-H Senior POWER Camp. District Council applicants must register and attend to be eligible to run for an office. There is an application process that must be completed by each district's deadline.

4-H'ERS SHOULD...

- Follow the camp rules set by Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service and High Plains Retreat Center.
- Know the 4-H pledge, the 4-H prayer and Texas pledge.
- Be on time and ready to participate in all ceremonial services.
- Show courtesy during ceremonial services.
- BE PREPARED TO CARRY OUT THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES IN CEREMONIALS, ETC.

SUPERVISION: 4-H members should be prepared to respond to supervision from all county agents present, not just their county agent.
