Age Categories: **3<sup>rd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> grade – Junior  
6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade – Intermediate  
9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade – Senior**

It is the responsibility of the agents to validate and correct placement of youth in age categories. Counties may move juniors up to intermediates, but intermediates can NOT be moved up to seniors or down to juniors.

### Accommodations

- Requests for accommodations must be submitted to the District Office from the County Office at least 2 weeks prior to the event.
- This request must be accompanied by official documentation in one of the following options for why the request is being submitted:
  - A) Official doctor's note from a licensed medical professional
  - B) School documentation and/or evaluation from a public institution
  - C) Official evaluation from a licensed professional therapist and/or diagnostician
- Note: The documentation and request are required within the appropriate timeline outlined for the event in order for the accommodation to be considered but does not guarantee that the requested accommodation can be made.
- The request will be reviewed by the district office (and when necessary, in consultation with the state office).
- Request and documentation will be kept confidential within the appropriate county/district staff and event administrators.

### **Classes**

There will be halter and performance classes in the Horse Judging contest. Halter classes will be chosen from stock type breeds. Performance classes will be chosen from the following: trail, western pleasure, western horsemanship, western riding, reining, showmanship at halter, hunter under saddle, hunt seat equitation, hunter hack, stock horse pleasure and ranch riding. **Seniors will give three sets of oral reasons. Intermediates and Juniors will give one set of oral reasons.**
